

Worksheet 3.2: Adjectives (comparative and superlative)

We use adjectives to compare two or more people, animals or things. The form of the adjective will depend on the kind of comparison we make. There are **three** degrees of comparison: **the positive degree, the comparative degree and the superlative degree.**

Degree of comparison	Rule	Example
1. the positive degree	is used when no comparison is involved	Ameer is a young man.
2. the comparative degree	is used when comparing two people, animals or things -We add -er to most adjectives to form their comparative form. In some cases, when the word has more than one syllable, we add more before the adjective. We use 'than' with comparative adjectives.	-My box is larger than yours. -Areej is younger than Sohail. -Sohail is more sensible than Areej.

<p>3. The superlative degree</p>	<p>is used when we compare more than two people, animals or things.</p> <p>- To form superlative adjectives, we either add -est to the adjectives or use most before some adjectives that have more than one syllable. Superlative adjectives are used with the article the before them.</p>	<p>- The largest bed belonged to Jim.</p> <p>- Najeeb is the youngest of the three boys.</p> <p>- Sam is the most sensible of the three boys.</p>
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➤ Note the spelling rules of forming comparatives and superlatives.

TWO syllables Ending in -Y	happy crazy	Remove the -Y and add -IER happier crazier	-IEST the happiest the craziest
TWO or MORE syllables	famous beautiful	MORE + more famous more beautiful	THE MOST + the most famous the most beautiful
