<b>Fiction</b>	
Real Life (realistic fiction)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The characters could be real people</li> <li>2. The setting can be real</li> <li>3. The events did not actually happen but they could have</li> <li>4. The plot is a familiar theme from everyday life</li> </ol>
Fairy Tale / Traditional Tale / Folk Tale	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. indistinct time and place</li> <li>2. animals behaving like humans (talking animals)</li> <li>3. characters playing tricks</li> <li>4. small brave characters</li> <li>5. a moral</li> <li>6. good triumphing over evil</li> <li>7. It has a happy ending</li> <li>8. It has magic</li> </ol>
Adventurous Story	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) characters (often children) face situations that need quick thinking</li> <li>2) a build-up to give hints and clues about what will happen</li> <li>3) obstacles to get over</li> <li>4) a resolution where the dilemma is solved</li> <li>5) exciting plot</li> <li>6) a hero or a heroine</li> <li>7) short, snappy sentences for effect</li> </ol>
