

A. Change the following sentences from direct speech into indirect speech.

1. Emma said to me, "I am doing my homework now."
→ Emma told me that she was doing her homework then.
2. Raj said, "We will go to the zoo next week."
→ Raj said that they would go to the zoo the following week.
3. Maya said, "I shall practice my presentation tonight."
→ Maya said that she should practice her presentation that night.
4. They said, "We are staying here today."
→ They said that they were staying there that day.
5. "I can visit the museum next month," Tom said.
→ Tom said that he could visit the museum the following month.
6. "I will help you tomorrow," she said.
→ She said that she would help me the next day.
7. He said, "These apples are fresh."
→ He said that those apples were fresh.
8. Sam said, "They are playing football next weekend."
→ Sam said that they were playing football the following weekend.
9. Jack said, "We are reading this book in class."
→ Jack said that they were reading that book in class.

B. Change the following sentences from direct speech into indirect speech.

1. "Do your homework now," mom ordered me.
→ Mom ordered me to do my homework then.
2. "Don't talk here," the teacher said to us.
→ The teacher told us not to talk there.
3. "Make your bed!" dad said to Tom.
→ Dad told Tom to make his bed.
4. The coach shouted, "Don't run fast!"
→ The coach shouted not to run fast.
5. The monster said to me, "Give me your candy."
→ The monster told me to give him my candy.
6. The monster said to me, "Don't take the candy."
→ The monster told me not to take the candy.
7. "Finish your homework before dinner tonight," Mom said to me.
→ Mom told me to finish my homework before dinner that night.

8. "Don't forget your umbrella," he reminded her.
→ He reminded her not to forget her umbrella.
9. "Take a deep breath and relax here," the doctor advised him.
→ The doctor advised him to take a deep breath and relax there.
10. "Do not enter this room now," the sign warned.
→ The sign warned not to enter that room then.

→ Lisa asked if I could help her then.
5. John asked, "Is this your pen?"
→ John asked if that was my pen.

→ My friend asked if I was wearing my shoes.
7. Mom asked me, "Are you hungry now?"
→ Mom asked me if I was hungry then.

→ They said that two plus two equals four.
