

A. Complete each of the following sentences using "will" or "going to".

1. I promise **will help** you with your homework later.

(Clue: this is a promise so use **will**.)

2. She **is going to eat** pizza for dinner because it's already in the oven.

(Clue: "already in the oven" - this is a planned action so use **going to**.)

3. We **are going to visit** the zoo tomorrow because we've already bought tickets.

(Clue: "already bought tickets" - this is a planned action so use **going to**.)

4. I **am going to study** for the test after school today.

(Clue: "after school today" - this is a planned action so use **going to**.)

5. The weather looks cloudy. It **is going to rain** soon.

(Clue: "cloudy" - there is prediction with evidence so use **going to**.)

6. My dad **is going to buy** me a new bike next month for my birthday.

(Clue: "next month" and a birthday plan - this is a planned action so use **going to**.)

7. I **am going to finish** my project tonight so I can submit it tomorrow.

(Clue: "tonight" - this is planned so use **going to**.)

8. I think they **will win** the match.

(Clue: "I think" - this is prediction without evidence so use **will**.)

9. They **are not going to come** to the party because they have another event.

(Clue: "they have another event" - this is planned so use **going to**.)

10. I **am going to call** you when I get home.

(Clue: "when I get home" - this is a planned action, so use **going to**.)

11. The teacher **will be** very happy when we complete the project.

(Clue: "be happy" - this is prediction without evidence so use **will**.)

12. Don't worry, I promise **will not forget** your birthday.

(Clue: this is a promise so use **will**.)

13. The dog is barking at the cat. It **is going to chase** it.

(Clue: "barking at the cat" - there is prediction with evidence so use **going to**.)

14. We **are going to have** lunch in the cafeteria today. It's on the schedule.

(Clue: "on the schedule" - this is a planned action so use **going to**.)

15. I **am going to try** to finish my chores before dinner.

(Clue: "before dinner" - this is a planned action so use **going to**.)

16. If he doesn't get his homework done, he **will not go** outside.

(Clue: threat so use **will**.)

17. I **am going to bring** my art supplies to school tomorrow.

(Clue: "tomorrow" and it's already decided so use **going to**.)

18. It's getting late so I **will go** to bed soon.

(Clue: "getting late" - this is a decision made now so use **will**.)

19. I **am not going to play** outside because it's raining.

(Clue: "because it's raining" - there is evidence with prediction so use **going to**.)

20. Mom **is going to take** us to the park if it stops raining.

(Clue: "if it stops raining" - a planned so use **going to**.)

21. We **are not going to visit** Grandma this weekend; we're going next weekend instead.

(Clue: "this weekend" is planned - so use **going to**.)

22. He **will be** angry if you break his toy.

(Clue: "if you break his toy" - this is a threat so use **will**.)

23. I **am not going to finish** the book tonight. It's too long.

(Clue: "it's too long" - there's evidence with prediction so use **going to**.)

24. She **is going to get** the job. She's the best candidate.

(Clue: "best candidate" - there's evidence so use **going to**.)

25. We promise **will be** more careful next time.

(Clue: "next time" - this is a promise so use **will**.)

26. I promise **will help** you clean up after my homework.

(Clue: "help you" - this is a promise, so use **will**.)

27. I think it **will be** a great summer.

(Clue: "I think" - this is evidence without prediction so use **will**.)

28. They **are not going to go** to the beach tomorrow; it's too cold.

(Clue: "too cold" - there is evidence with prediction so use **going to**.)

29. We **are going to have** a test on Monday.

(Clue: "on Monday" - it's planned so use **going to**.)

30. You **are going to win** the game if you keep practicing!

(Clue: "if you keep practicing" - this is evidence with prediction so use **going to**.)
