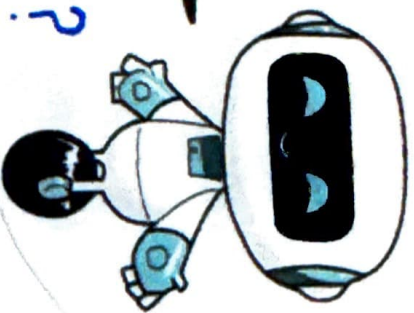

Some sounds, such as that made by bats, are too high-pitched for humans to hear. How are such sounds useful to bats?

Explain?



Bats use high-pitched sounds, called echolocation, to help them find food and navigate in the dark. They make these

sounds and listen to the echoes that bounce back. By hearing how the sound reflects off objects,

bats can tell where things are, like insects or obstacles, even if they can't see them. This helps

them "see" in the dark!
