

Let's Learn

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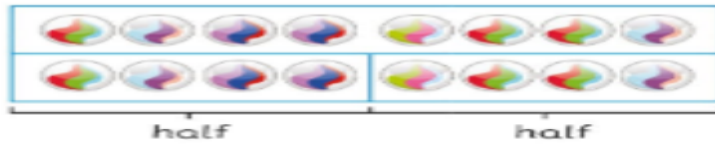
- a The square has two equal parts

One equal part is shaded.
Half of this square is shaded.



- b Eddy has 8 marbles.

He puts his marbles equally into two bags.



You can write
half as $\frac{1}{2}$.

Double 4 is 8.
So, half of 8 is 4.



Eddy and Izzy have
17 marbles altogether.
Eddy says he has half
of the marbles.
Is he correct?
Why or why not?



*Half of 16 is 8. The one extra marble
cannot be split into two equal parts.
So, if Eddy and Izzy have 17 marbles,
Eddy cannot have half of the marbles.
So, Eddy is not correct.)*

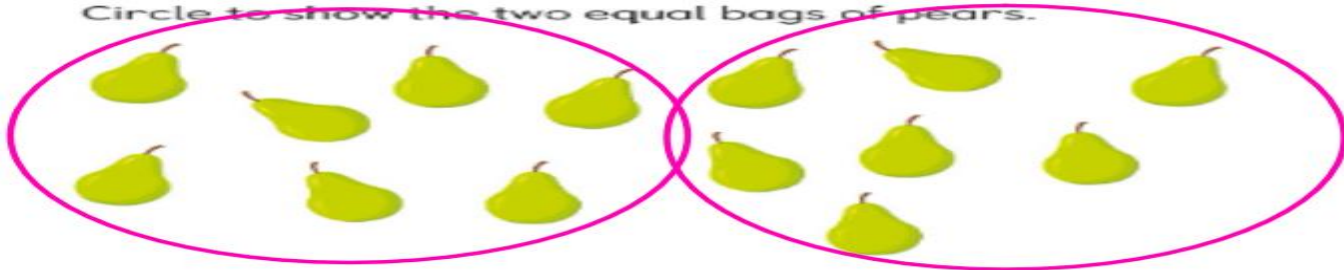
Let's Practise

- 3 Ralph and his friends eat 2 apples, 5 oranges and a banana.

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This is double the fruit Ralph eats.
How many fruit does Ralph eat?

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
