

Part 'A' Common and proper nouns


A noun could be either **common** or **proper**.

A **common noun** names any person, place or thing. **Common nouns** don't start with a capital letter and are often preceded by a, an or the.


A **proper noun** names a particular person, place or thing. **Proper nouns** start with a capital letter.

Part 'B' Singular and plural nouns



A singular noun means one.

A plural noun means more than one.

Plural nouns usually end in -s or -es.

Singular nouns	Plural nouns
I have one dog.	I have two dogs.
I have one box.	I have two boxes.

Language Tip: To express quantity in plural nouns, we can use numbers and other words such as, little, few, a lot of, many, much, ...etc.

Rules for forming plural nouns:

1- For most of the nouns, you just add -s:

<u>Singular Nouns</u>	<u>Plural Nouns</u>
house	houses
rock	rocks
table	tables
hand	hands

pencil	pencils
chair	chairs
shoe	shoes
spoon	spoons
car	cars
cushion	cushions

floor	floors
bag	bags
coat	coats
book	books
gate	gates
shop	shops
rabbit	rabbits
flower	flowers
dog	dogs
axe	axes
file	files
centre	centres
girl	girls
computer	computers

2- If a word ends in -ch, -sh, -s, -ss, -z or -x, add -es.

<u>Singular nouns</u>	<u>Plural nouns</u>
church	churches
bench	benches
beach	beaches
match	matches
watch	watches
torch	torches
eyelash	eyelashes
brush	brushes
dish	dishes
wax	waxes
kiss	kisses
address	addresses
class	classes
glass	glasses
dress	dresses
six	sixes
bus	buses
tax	taxes
fox	foxes
box	boxes

Exceptions: If the -ch ending is pronounced with "k" sound, then just add -s: stomach - stomachs
