A **Phrasal Verb** is a word used together with a **preposition** or an **adverb** depending on how it has been used. A phrasal verb can have different meanings - its meaning is derived from the context.

Phrasal verbs with **look**:

look after	take care of someone or something Example: <i>The baby sitter looks after the baby.</i>
look for	to search for someone or something I am looking for my purse.
look up	search for and find a piece of information in a book or database Example: <i>I can look up the address in the address book.</i>
look at	turn your attention to, examine Example: <i>Take a look at that new building.</i>
look forward to	await something eagerly Example: <i>"We look forward to seeing you."</i>
