Noun

Noun

A noun is the name of a person, place, thing, or idea. Such as, man, house, desk, etc.

Example:

The young girl brought me a very long letter from the teacher, and then she quickly disappeared.

Pronoun

Pronoun

A pronoun is a word used in place of a noun. Such as, he, she, it, they, we, etc.

Example:

The young girl brought me a very long letter from the teacher, and then she quickly disappeared.

Verb

Verb

A verb expresses an action or state of being. Such as, jump, is, buy, etc.

Example:

The young girl brought me a very long letter from the teacher, and then she quickly disappeared.

Adjective

Adjective

An adjective modifies or describes a noun or pronoun. Such as, pretty, blue, old, smart, etc.

Example:

The young girl brought me a very long letter from the teacher, and then she quickly disappeared.

Adverb

Adverb

An adverb modifies or describes a verb, an adjective, or another adverb.
Such as, **gently**, **extremely**, **carefully**, etc.

Example:

The young girl brought me a very long letter from the teacher, and then she quickly disappeared.

Preposition

Preposition

A preposition is a word placed before a noun or pronoun to form a phrase modifying another word in the sentence. Such as, by, with, about, until, etc.

Example:

The young girl brought me a very long letter from the teacher, and then she quickly disappeared.
