The **Past Simple Tense** is used to talk about something that started and finished at a definite time in the past.

PAST SIMPLE TENSE |

Usage

Example

To express completed action in the past

I saw a ghost last Friday.

To describe a series of completed actions in the past

I finished work, walked to the beach, and found a nice place to swim.

To express habits in the past

When I was young, I watched lots of television every day after school.



Spelling rules of the past simple tense

The main rule for every regular verb in English is to add the inflectional ending -ed.

Examples: want: wanted - play: played

✓Rules for adding -ed:

1. When a verb ends in 'e', we drop the 'e' before adding -ed.

Examples: dance - danced bake- baked

2. When a verb ends in consonant + y, change the y to i and add ed.

Example: try- tried carry- carried cry- cried

3. When a verb ends in vowel + y, keep the y and add ed.

Example: play- played stay- stayed

4. When a verb ends in a short vowel followed by a consonant (CVC), we double the consonant before adding -ed.

Examples- slip: slipped - drop: dropped

Exceptions to the CVC rule are words that end in w or x like flowed, waxed and fixed.

Spelling Rules for adding ED

Add ed	
Walk	Walk ed
Talk	Talk ed
Paint	Paint ed
Join	Join ed

If the verb ends with e then add d	
Arrive	Arrived
Refuse	Refused
Smile	Smiled

When there is a vowel before y add ed	
Play	Play ed
Obey	Obey ed
Stay	Stay ed
Enjoy	Enjoy ed

When there is a consonant before y , change y to i add ed	
Carry	Carried
Fry	Fried
Study	Studied
Dry	Dried

When there is a cvc , double the consonant and add ed	
Stop	Stop ped
Hop	Hop ped
Plan	Plan ned
Slip	Slip ped

Irregular Verbs

- An **irregular verb** is a verb that does not form its simple past tense by adding "-ed" to the base form.

Example- buy - bought catch- caught fly- flew

The Past Simple Tense in the Negative Form

Negative sentences in the Past Simple Tense

Subject + „did not“ + verb + object

I did not do that.

She did not feel good yesterday.

Example:

You **did not** win the prize.

The Past Simple Tense in the Interrogative Form

Questions in the Past Simple Tense

„Did“ + subject + verb + object ?

Did you hear that loud noise that night?

Did he clean his shoes before he came in?

Example:

Did you **eat** your sandwich?
