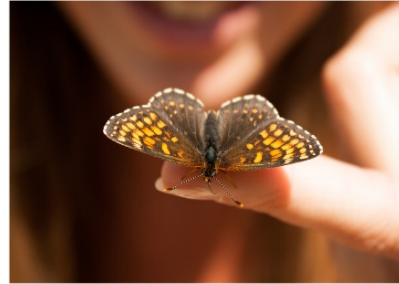

1.) fluttered:

-Part of speech: Verb



-Meaning: to move or cause to move with a striking motion.

-Synonym: waved / flicked / whipped

-Sentence: Rita **fluttered** her eyelashes as she struck up a conversation with her new friend at work.



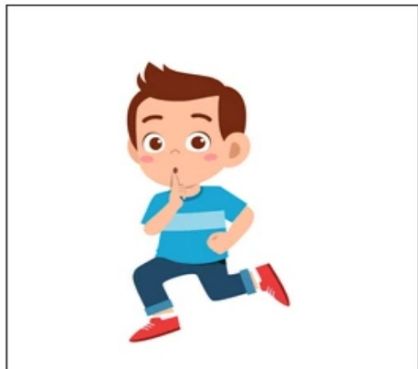
2.) inched:

-**Part of speech:** Verb

-**Meaning:** moved in tiny steps.

-**Synonym:** crept / sneaked / wormed

-**Sentence:** Every year the water **inches** further up the embankment, threatening to permanently engulf the island city.



3.) embankment:

-Part of speech: Noun

-Meaning: riverbank

-Synonym: levee / dam / canal

-Sentence: We were very careful crossing the river because the **embankment** was very steep.



4.) drenched:

-Part of speech: Adjective

-Meaning: containing, covered with , thoroughly penetrated by water.

-Synonym: dripping / soaked / wet / bathed

-Sentence: The man was **drenched** with water because it was raining.



5.) gurgling:

-Part of speech: Verb



-Meaning: as in splashing / to flow in a broken irregular stream

-Synonym: splashing / bubbling / washing / dripping

-Sentence: The tiny stream gugled down the rocky slope and joined the larger river at the bottom of the hill.



6.) clung:

-Part of speech: Verb

-Meaning: to hold to something firmly as if by adhesion

-Synonym: glued / stuck / adhered

-Antonym: dropped / loosened / fell

-Sentence: Sara has a dozen magnets **clinging** to the refrigerator because she likes to buy one as a souvenir on each trip.



7.) grazing:

-**Part of speech:** Verb

-**Meaning:** to feed on grass or herbs

-**Synonym:** foraging / feeding / eating

-**Sentence:** While Jack was cleaning the garden, the cows were **grazing** in the meadow.



8.) oblige:

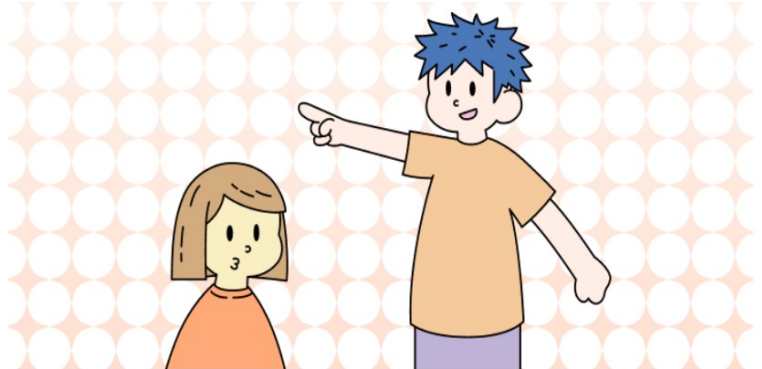
-**Part of speech:** Verb

-**Meaning:** do as you are asked

-**Synonyms:** help / assist / please / delight / satisfy

-**Antonyms:** bother / disturb / burden / trouble

-**Sentence:** I would appreciate it greatly if you could **oblige** me by bringing a dessert to the party.



9.) steppes:

-**Part of speech:** Noun

-**Meaning:** open fields

-**Synonyms:** plains / grasslands / meadows / savannas

-**Sentence:** Nomads have long grazed yaks on the **steppes** of Mondolia which they raise in herds.
