Simile (their branches reaching out like twisted arms) - It gives the reader the feeling that Anna is trapped or being surrounded by the trees. / The simile makes the forest seem scary, as if the trees are alive and trying to grab Anna. [2]

9 Which two descriptions correctly describe the cottage's condition?

2. Detailed, Unsettling Descriptions
3. Sudden Events
4. Cliffhanger Ending: Anna feels she is being watched, but sees nothing in the mist.
