She needs to take 10 ml of the medicine.

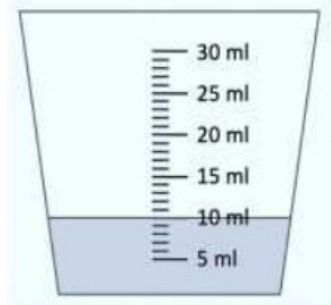
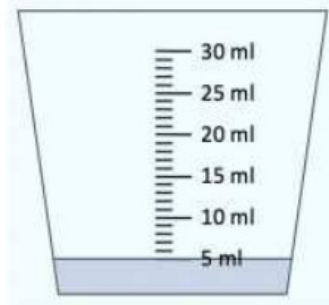
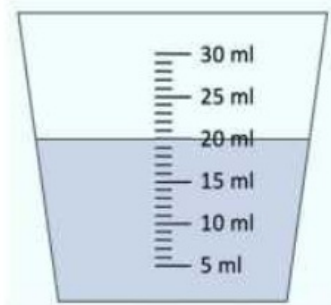
George is taking another liquid medicine prescribed by his doctor.

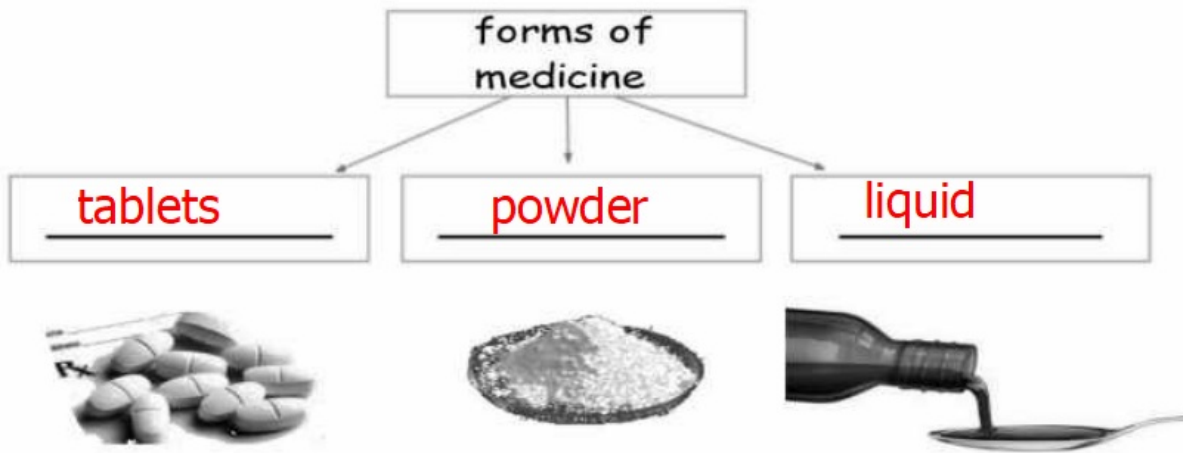
