Modal Verb	Use / Meaning	Example Sentence
<b>can</b>	ability / possibility	She <b>can</b> swim very well.
<b>can't</b>	inability / impossibility	He <b>can't</b> lift the heavy box.
<b>could</b>	past ability / polite request	When I was five, I <b>could</b> ride a bike.
<b>couldn't</b>	past inability	I <b>couldn't</b> open the door yesterday.
<b>may</b>	permission / possibility	You <b>may</b> leave early today.
<b>may not</b>	not allowed	You <b>may not</b> use your phone in class.
<b>might</b>	small possibility	It <b>might</b> rain later.
<b>will</b>	future / certainty	I <b>will</b> finish my homework tonight.
<b>won't / will not</b>	refusal / future negative	He <b>won't</b> come to school tomorrow.
<b>shall</b>	suggestions / offers (formal)	<b>Shall</b> we start the lesson?
<b>should</b>	advice	You <b>should</b> sleep early.
<b>shouldn't / should not</b>	negative advice	You <b>shouldn't</b> eat too much candy.
<b>must</b>	strong obligation / rule	You <b>must</b> wear your seatbelt.
<b>mustn't / must not</b>	prohibition	Students <b>mustn't</b> run in the hallways.
<b>have to</b>	obligation	I <b>have to</b> prepare for next week's party.
